The DDZ as an interdisciplinary Institute links molecular and cell biological basic research with clinical investigation.

- Establishing and heading a research group to work on peripheral neuropathy with a focus on painful neuropathy using preclinical in vivo and in vitro models
- Acquisition of third-party money
- · Documentation, publication and presentation of research data
- Preclinical in vivo investigation into the treatment of diabetes-related painful peripheral neuropathy.

## We expect:

- University degree in Biology, Biochemistry, Pharmacy, Veterinary Medicine, or a comparable discipline
- PhD, MD or similar degree with a very good score
- Very good communication skills (in writing and verbally)
- · High-profile, published experience in preclinical investigations (in vivo) into peripheral neuropathy
- Very good organization skills and experience in Statistics

## We offer:

- Expertise in preclinical in vivo models of diabetes mellitus
- Technician with expertise in in vivo work on peripheral pain and diabetes
- Clinical expertise in diabetic neuropathies and neuropathic pain
- If highly prestigious third-party funding of the research group (such as ERC starting grant or Emmy Noether) is acquired or brought to the DDZ, a tenured position is possible at the end of the third-party funding of the research group
- Possibility to develop as group leader to work in the field of diabetic peripheral neuropathy, gain further preclinical and clinical education and experiences in a versatile and translational research environment
- The initial contract runs for 4 years with an option of prolongation or tenure (in case of ERC starting grant or Emmy Noether funding).
- The salary is based on qualification and experience according to TV-L in its current version for North Rhine-Westphalia.
- The DDZ is committed to family-friendly working conditions and equal gender policy. Since May 2011, the DDZ is a "Career and Family" audit-acknowledged Center.
- Women are encouraged to apply, and in the case of equal qualification will be given preference.
- Persons with disabilities will be given preference.
